SVDP Interim Report - St Andrew's SVDP conference exists to help to meet the needs of those in both social and material poverty in our neighbourhood in particular and in the Archdiocese in general. Thanks to the generosity of parishioners, in the last 6 months of 2023, St Andrew's SVDP has been able to support St Nicholas' Primary P7 residential outing with c.£400, purchase bed frames and mattresses for a local family, and provide Drumchapel food bank with £500 in food vouchers, Lincoln Flats Community Kitchen with £500, and our twin parish in India with £120. We also donated £1500 to support a student through the Glasgow SVDP scholarship programme and £500 to assist those in need in each of the parishes of St Laurence's, St Gregory's and St Columba's. We have also begun local visits to meet the social and spiritual needs of the housebound and those in care homes. The conference also encourages and supports a group of Mini Vinnies in St Nicholas' Primary school. This group mirrors the activities of the SVDP conference of organising projects to help the poor and homeless in Glasgow. This term the group organised the preparation of Christmas cards and selection boxes for distribution to those attending the Wayside Club Centre at Christmas.
