I am sure many of us joined a gym after Christmas and promised that things would be different, how is that going?


Pope Francis has designated 2025 a Jubilee Year. We are pilgrims of hope and so let us be full of hope, for the future, for our World and for our love of Christ.

Ensuring St Andrew's is fit for purpose for generations to come and thanks to your continuing generosity, we have been able to carry out major works last year. These form part of the St Andrew's estate that we don't really see. However, the forty -year- old boiler kit was in need of retirement. We have been able to completely renew the entire heating system in the church house and renew the bathroom . Together with this we renewed the church boilers, all associated pipework, electrical plant and installed a heating management control system.

The Drumchapel Food Bank

The Drumchapel Food Bank is 3.2 miles from St Andrew's and our local primary school, St Nicholas'. The foodbank is housed in the KCEDC Commercial Centre in Ladyloan Place, Glasgow G15 8LB.

The Drumchapel foodbank is an independent project, which totally relies on your generosity and that of local people, organisations and businesses, to help those in financial crisis.

You can place tinned, packet and dried goods in the wooden box in the church porch until 5pm during the week, or mass times during the weekend.

Cash donations, posted through the letterbox of the parish house, are used by the finance group to send food directly to the foodbank. Please mark the envelope "For the Foodbank".

Food from the parish is delivered every Monday by our volunteer drivers.
