### **Mid Term Holiday**


School will close for the mid-term break on Friday 9th February at 2.55pm and will reopen to pupils on Thursday 15th February at 9am.

## TURNBULL HIGH SCHOOL HMIe INSPECTION REPORT 5 DECEMBER 2023



HMIe Inspectors published a glowing report about our school following visits last year and this has given everyone at Turnbull High the best possible start to 2024.

### Some of the many key strengths highlighted in the report were:

- The headteacher's strong and caring leadership, supported by the senior management team, is highly valued across the school community.
- Teachers have very strong approaches to checking how well learners are progressing and attaining. As a result, young people can confidently discuss their strengths and next steps in learning.
- Young people's attainment and achievements are very strong across the school.
- Staff use targeted approaches to supporting specific young people who require additional support. Care experienced young people are very well supported to achieve and attain.
- The school's strong, faith-based ethos and Catholic identity ensure young people feel valued and included across the school community.



## **Absence Procedures**

Thank you for your continued partnership with us in ensuring that your child's attendance is maximised and that the reason for any absence is recorded promptly and accurately.

Please find below a reminder of the procedures for advising the school of your child's absence.

As you will be aware, if you do not inform us that your child is going to be absent, we will take action to find your child.

This will involve:

- contacting you and, where necessary, your emergency contact person(s).
- If we are not able to contact you:
  - we will ask the school's Home Link Officer (Attendance Officer) to visit your home.
  - we may also contact the Police and/or Social Work where a child's whereabouts are unknown and where we cannot establish the reason for absence.

We require parents and carers to let us know of any absence before the start of the school day using the Parents Portal.

If an absence is planned, you can tell us of this in advance using the Portal. We encourage all parents and carers to report absences through the Parents Portal (parentsportal.scot) rather than by email or telephone.

### **Register for myaccount**

Parents Portal: what is it and how do I access it?



# Last year, East Dunbartonshire Council changed the way schools and families communicate with each other through the introduction of a new online service called parentsportal.scot.

This is an online portal designed to be a one-stop shop for a number of school-related activities and will create a new digital relationship between home and school. Through time, it is hoped this portal will replace the traditional 'schoolbag run' and make communicating with one another easier and more efficient.

At the heart of the system is an online account created by the Scottish Government called **myaccount**. This is a secure method of accessing **parentsportal.scot** which will allow you to link to your child and carry out the following tasks using a single sign-on approach:

- Make online payments (cashless catering)
- Report an absence
- View pupils' attendance
- View pupils' timetable
- View trips and events
- View school holidays
- View school twitter feed
- Book appointments for Parents' Evenings
- Update contact details
- Receive notices from the school
- Apply for Young Persons' Free Bus Travel Scheme (for 5-10 year olds)
- Complete the annual data check (that's when we check emergency contacts etc).

Before you can access the many features parentsportal.scot has to offer, you **must** first have a **myaccount**. If you do not already have an account, there are instructions in the frequently asked questions (FAQs) below on how to set one up. Once you have done this you can then **register** for **parentsportal.scot**. Please follow the instructions in the FAQs to do this.

Please find below an excerpt from each of the strands:

### STRAND A: TEACHING AND LEARNING ABOUT RIGHTS

Pupils shared a wide selection of rights and were confident in discussing concepts, also sharing their belief that , "...all children should learn about rights."

Staff spoke of rights "shining though" in their classes, sharing a view that "the rights of the child are intrinsic to all that we do."

Parents voiced that they found the Turnbull Times helpful in keeping them up to date on the school's rights journey.

### STRAND B: TEACHING AND LEARNING THROUGH RIGHTS - ETHOS AND RELATIONSHIPS

Pupils were clear that they felt safe and supported in school, equality certain that there was a trusted adult in school with whom they could speak to about any concerns.

The head teacher commented, "All children have a right to an education. "It's about inclusivity and putting the child first."

Parents noted that the school's work on supporting positive relationships, "Speaking as a parent, the overwhelming feeling I get is that children are very cared for, known as an individual and are being celebrated."

### STRAND C: TEACHING AND LEARNING FOR RIGHTS - PARTICIPATION, EMPOWERMENT AND ACTION

Pupils spoke of the work to support causes through fund raising and donations, including their support for a school in Liberia through Mary's Meals.

Senior leaders spoke of the voice of all learners being valued: "The proof of the pudding, it's the impact...We want to get more and more young people involved...bringing those harder to reach on board."

The use of How Good is Our School evaluation processes ensures that pupils voices are heard on a wide range of significant issues.

Catholic Education Week takes place every year between the feast of St Margaret of Scotland on 16th November and St Andrew's Day on 30th November.





### S1 Cryptography Challenge








### S2 Learned about Magic Squares

Magic squares are created with boxes filled with digits so that every row, column and diagonal all add to the same number.








**RETURN OF THE CRYSTAL**






### Magic Maths with Algebra in S4



Every Friday from Until the end of November, the classes have been designing and building their bridges.


The rules:


- the bridge must span 30cm.
- the bridge must be made from lollipop sticks, cable ties, string and card only.
- the bridge cannot be tethered or stuck to the table in any way.
- the bridges were assessed on durability (how many water bottles can it hold), aesthetics, cost (all materials were recorded and an overall price was given) and how well the team worked together.

For the next three weeks they worked on building their bridges and at the end of November all bridges were tested in classes to find a winner for each house group. These bridges went through to the grand final.







Due to the number of bridges that could hold five or more water bottles, we borrowed some weight from the Science Department to test the bridges to destruction. Two bridges could not be destructed.


